



University Partnerships are Successful

- Engagement scores from freshman education students earn our highest ranking.
- University participants doubled after one semester thanks to student recommendations.
- Positive relationships are built between elementary kids and college students

Freshman education programs partner for a full school year (one class per semester)



- University students arrive 30 minutes prior to each session to prepare and welcome the children to the one-hour long weekly sessions.
 - College students build teaching skills in a supervised environment.
 - BE THE DIFFERENCE™ message is shared and modeled.
 - After each H.U.G. session, college students remain at the elementary school to review session and continue education with college instructor.
 - College students earn credit hours.
- All tutors participate in a 10-minute debrief after each session with a H.U.G Specialist.
- University students remain at the elementary school to meet with their professor and continue their learning experience.

Leveraging H.U.G. to enhance college education

- College professor incorporates H.U.G. Reading Program into semester-long, course curriculum.
 - H.U.G. uses a scripted, evidenced-based curriculum developed by the University of North Carolina. It has 30 years of proven research behind it and was vetted by JCPS as an approved intervention.
 - Tutors gain first-hand experience working with students, using a standard curriculum, and capturing outcomes.
- At the beginning of each semester the college students who enroll in the course will:
 - o go to www.hugreadingprogram.org to sign H.U.G.'s Code of Ethics and photo/video release forms. Then they receive a link to complete the JCPS background check.
 - o participate in training conducted by a H.U.G. Representative at the college.
- Once trained, the college students will:
 - go to the elementary school where a H.U.G. Specialist will assign each of them a 2nd or 3rd grade H.U.G. Student to work with for the semester.
 - o engage in weekly H.U.G. sessions at the elementary school.
 - o remain after each session to review and learn from their course professor.
