H.U.G. captures data every lesson.






Our 1:1 student-to-tutor ratio builds skills & character

H.U.G. Slows the School-to-Prison Pipeline


1:1 H.U.G. student to tutor ratio **16%** of reading test scores increase for 3rd grade H.U.G. participants 44%



High School Partnerships Provide Positive Growth Paths

- Mentoring experience introduces high school students to the world of teaching, hospitality, leadership, and inspiring others.
- High school students earn volunteer service hours.
- H.U.G. students benefit from meeting older students who take the time to help them.

High School programs partner for a full school year; students have option to do one or two semesters

- High schoolers arrive 30 minutes prior to each session to prepare and welcome the children to the one-hour long weekly sessions.
 - BE THE DIFFERENCE[™] message is shared and modeled.
 - High schoolers build mentoring skills in a supervised environment.
- All tutors participate in a 10-minute debrief after each session with a H.U.G Specialist.
- High schools are encouraged to assign a faculty sponsor to meet with participating students and further help them to grow their mentoring skills. If you would like us to provide support as well, please let us know.



Leveraging H.U.G. to enhance high school education

- High School incorporates H.U.G. Reading Program into semester-long, course curriculum.
 - H.U.G. uses a scripted, evidenced-based curriculum developed by the University of North Carolina. It has 30 years of proven research behind it and was vetted by JCPS as an approved intervention.
 - Tutors gain first-hand experience working with students, using a standard curriculum, and capturing outcomes.
- At the beginning of each semester the high school students who enroll in the course will:
 - go to <u>www.hugreadingprogram.org</u> to sign H.U.G.'s Code of Ethics and photo/video release forms. Then they receive a link to complete the JCPS background check. If they are currently a JCPS student, this does not need to be completed.
 - participate in training conducted by a H.U.G. Representative at your school.
- Once trained, the high school students will:
 - go to the elementary school where a H.U.G. Specialist will assign each of them a 2nd or 3rd grade H.U.G. Student to work with for the semester.
 - engage in weekly H.U.G. sessions at the elementary school.
